4. Centre Manager's Report

5. Treasurer's Report

- a. The attached printed sheets are a summary record of all the transactions made by the Senior Section for the Financial Year 1st January to 31st December 2023. These have been verified by Hans Bauder, treasurer of the main Club.
- b. Our account remains with NatWest where we use Online Banking. All monies continue to be collected using the Square Terminals with Square charging 1.75% of each transaction before transferring the balance into our bank.

- c. Most of the income is from the Monday Club and Thursday competitions. The Home and Away match and Captain's Day income and expenditure continues to be administered through the accounts.
- d. The system of prize monies being paid onto Member Levy cards has gone well and in February the 2s prize money began to be paid in the same way. I thank Richard Hone, David Costin and Georgie and the accounts team for administering the updating of the Prize Levy on a weekly basis. A total of £7,607.50 has been issued in prize monies plus £2,900 for the 2s.
- e. The Monday Club continues to thrive with player numbers reaching 80 on occasion. This has the knock on effect of more prize money and a little more in the Senior Section coffers. Total income recorded for the year is £19,388 with a total expenditure of £18,511.61. Last year the committee set a budget for expenditure as our reserves were lower than previous years. I'm happy to report that we stuck to the budgeting and with the higher player numbers we have increased our reserves by £876.39. We do have unavoidable expenses that we need to cover and as has been experienced by the recent cancellations of matches this also reduces our income too.
- f. The balance of £2,899.76 was brought forward from 2022 and this now gives a carry forward balance of £3,776.15 to 2024. The reconciliation page shows the current bank account balance total at 31.12.23 and how this reconciles with the balance carried forward.
- g. The Seniors Section has contributed £348 to the Main Club Charity Day and £315 to their Charities. We also contribute to the floral display at the front of the clubhouse.

Centre Managers Report

Another year that has seemingly flown by and was filled with ups, downs with all the trials and tribulations that come with that.

The biggest issue we faced this last year was the dramatic increase in rainfall year on year.

2023 was the wettest year on record at an outstanding 1,214 MM of rain (previous year we had 699mm. HALF of that came from September to December. **Here – I have to congratulate and thank the Green Keeping team who did everything in their power to keep the courses open as much as possible.** Whilst local courses to us were often closed – our team managed to keep play going.

Small things we can do to help the team is closing the front 9s, and back 9s of the courses through out the week over the year to allow them work on the greens in one go. We used to do this hole by hole – and meant a lot of stop starting. This worked tremendously well in 2023 and we plan to continue that and I would like to thank the members for their patience with this.

5th and 6th issues on the main course – I am sure you all saw the minis streams across these 2 greens. Both have always been wet holes – but with this year downfall – it is highlighted the need to put some drainage in here.

The 5th green had issues with the pond on the righthand side. It became blocked with debris and we believe the water was back filling an old clay pipe that opened up underneath the green. The team have cleared the outlet and we seem to have cracked that dilemma. **6th Green and surrounding area** is still wet. Its possible an underground spring has opened up. Regardless of the reason, we are in the process of getting quotes for drainage for both holes.

Other challenges for us has been the stark uplift in costs. Minimum wage increase last April by 10%, and it is due to increase by another 10% in April this year.

Over 60 members of the team – it will be a big increase in cost for us. Although the electricity hike reducing has really helped this year after last years extortion!

Despite the hikes we have had a great year and the range is really allowing us to re-invest into the course and clubhouse.

Over the last 3 years we have invested over £850,000 into Ramsdale with a further plan of £450,000 in 2024. This does not include the expenditure updating the range in 2020. Out of this year's Capital Investment - £270,000 is earmarked for the course. This includes some decent gear for Johnny and his team, moving to electrical vehicles where possible. Finally we have the leaf collector authorised! Along with the long awaited practise nets. We just need to figure out where to put them.

Kitchen – as you know the kitchen has been the same for 32 years and although we got the highest possible rating for food hygiene – EHO did tell us that without investment and upgrades – the result would not be the same on their next visit.

Hopefully, on Friday we take back our shiny new kitchen which will make service quicker and the chefs a nice fresh space to work in!

Members

Since the winter of 2020, we have had a closed 7 day membership category. We have operated a one in one out policy. This has been a subsequence of me keeping the subscription increases slightly lower than our competitors, the course being in such amazing condition and the team – and of course – the members.

The increase in June will again be lower than the 10% industry standard and likely to work out around £1.60 per week. Confirmation will be out once confirmed.

Again – despite pressure from competitors – I will NOT be introducing joining fees or administration fees.

Currently we are sitting at 923 members which includes all categories – juniors included. This time last year we had 952. The waiting list for 7 day remains full with about 42 people on the list waiting for a spot.

2024 – Plans

- New kitchen – nearly finished
- Seely course will be re-rated this year and the Par 3 (for the first time) will also be rated

I'd like to begin by saying that I'm delighted to be standing here as your 2024 Captain. I am honoured by your trust and thank you for the opportunity. I can say that when asked last year to take on this role I had no hesitation. I've probably been involved in 20 sports clubs in the past, covering 5 sports and Ramdale's Seniors Section is the best run sports organisation I have yet to encounter. It is a very enjoyable privilege to be serving alongside your committee, enthusiastic, dedicated, accomplished and hardworking clubmen and club lady all.

I should also add my acknowledgement to the fact that our section thrives not only because of you it's members but because of the fantastic team that is Theresa and all her 60 staff. On behalf of Ramsdale Seniors I would like to thank you for your amazing leadership and everything that is done by your team on our behalf. I would like to thank you Terry for your exemplary leadership last season, showing me the way, with your jolly, very efficient and unflappable style and ensuring along with Richard in particular, that this transition and handover is seamless. I know Terry will miss his designated parking space but that extra walk and disorientation might create sufficient fatigue to give us all, more of a chance of undoing his recent run of blistering form! He's set a real big bench mark for me this season, especially having recorded 2 holes in one. I hope however to quell the rumour that it's not possible for a Captain to play well during his year at the helm. Terry in recognition of your achievements and our new friendship I'd like to give you this memento!

Moving on ... a bit of background about me, so you know what you are getting.....
I graduated from Loughborough University as a PE Teacher and taught physical education in 3 schools while playing mainly Rugby and Tennis, ending my rugby career as Captain of Market Rasen Rugby Club. I only took to golf in my 40s but recently had a long break from the game, when my second wife to be, Rosie said "You can have me and golf, me and music but not both"! My clubs duly went into the garage, only to re-emerge during lockdown when my son-in law wanted to start playing. I got out of teaching after 22 years when I saw an opportunity with a Sports Training company based over in Melton Mowbray. The successful Speed Agility Quickness Programme under-pinned the success of the England Rugby Team, World Cup winners in 2003 and all Premiership and League Football Teams. I discovered at Sunderland Football Club one day that I have a striking resemblance to their, then Manager Mick McCarthy, when the first team mistook me at a distance for him. I offered to be his stand in at Pro-Am golf days in Ireland, but he politely told me - "No"! The SAQ training method was also used by many other sports including golf, British Bob sleigh and even in Dog Agility Training. My main role was to run training courses and apply the Fundamental Movement programme to physical education in all schools both Primary and Secondary and Special. It was an experience that took me to every county in the UK and 12 different countries internationally. I once ran a rugby-based course in Bucharest, Romania for 30 coaches from 8 different East European nations. I didn't even know that Bosnia played rugby then, but it was a joy to be alongside Bosnian, Croat and Serb coaches who not many years before had been trying to blow each other to smithereens. All reunited again by the power of Sport! I'm proud to say that our legacy still remains because when you see a dynamic warm up, a run over mini hurdles or through fast foot ladders or performers being attached to elastic resistors you are witnessing SAQ Training. I have been privileged to work with Olympians, Internationals, performers across many sports and school children of all ages and abilities, but one of my most endearing memories was of enabling an 11-year boy with cerebral palsy to eventually walk and run without a limp! I finished my teaching/coaching career working 1-1 with children across Nottinghamshire who are unable to access mainstream education. Oh, the earlier mention of music or golf was because I'm also a semi-pro Jazz Saxophonist. So how do I see my role this season as your Captain? Well firstly I wish to play my part in something that you all contribute to already - that is the sociable, knowledgeable, and competitive atmosphere that is created in this clubhouse every week. With that in mind I wish to keep in touch and learn from your experiences, by playing my golf across as many groups as possible during the season. I hope this season I can contribute to the longevity and improved performance in your golf and use this year as an opportunity to give something back. This is because I have learned so much from so many of you in

the last 3 years. 'Down the middle' from John Chadwick - excellence, course management and the rules from Mick Duffy - winning and losing at match play with my 2- time Pairs partner Neil Harris - playing every round with a smile on your face from Rob Macdonald-how to play alongside the ladies from Stuart Murray and how to make the most of a purple patch from that winning, winter phenomenon John Lowton. We cannot forget also how much John O'Neil and Garth Hallam inspire us every week. The list is endless. I am delighted therefore that many of you have registered your interest in my Captain's initiative to bring a focus to putting this season. I hope to see you at some workshops, accessing some tips on the website, counting your scores on the green and pushing one or two deserving players to the title of Aggregate Putter of the Year and after a nail- biting final shoot out on the putting green Champion Putter of the Year. The special prizes will be hand -crafted with willing sponsors (hint hint) duly acknowledged)! To my main role as Captain in the Team Matches, I am anticipating a big sign up for the team, for which I am grateful. However once again places will be at a premium, because of opponents who can only put out a team of 12 whereas we can play 16 every week. I hope to continue where Terry left off in supporting players of all abilities and experience in representing Ramsdale and will do my best to be as fair as possible, at the same time keeping a close eye on current form. I don't yet have the satisfaction of scoring a whole in 1! However, those of you who have arrived on the 16th tee with me, know I am proud to recount (again and again) my only special golfing achievement - scoring an Eagle! I think it's an achievement amongst members worth highlighting and so I am putting up a Captain's prize to any of you who record an eagle during a competitive round recognised by the Senior Section. I still smile with admiration when I hear again about Will Davis's feat on the 3rd hole - his second shot a 186 yards iron that broke the cup with its direct entry. Lastly, I am pleased to announce one more Captain's initiative still very much in the discussion phase, which will be a one- day Mixed Pairs Competition organised in conjunction with the Ladies Captain Doreen Musgrove. To end - it now gives me great pleasure to announce who is our Senior Vice-Captain this year. He is gracing us with his presence today, having flown back early from a warm winter training camp. He has been preparing for the new season on not just one course but 4 golf courses. He has a glowing reputation particularly as a representative of that much maligned section of society - left handers. He is a multi-competition winner, plays more rounds of golf at Ramsdale than anyone else (there is no truth in the rumour that Theresa is about to impose a special levy on him for additional wear and tear on the course), He's a master of graphics as you've already witnessed and basically just a really great bloke to be around.
